Kathy Wallace, graduate of the class of 1970, is the recipient of the 2022 Outstanding Alumnus Award given by the Bellaire High School Alumni Association. Kathy is recognized for her tireless support for the Bellaire Community, and her Alma Mater, Bellaire High School.

Kathy is a lifelong resident of Bellaire. She is the proud daughter of the late Philip and Nance Bass Wallace. She is the blessed niece of the late John and Gertrude Wallace Klee and James R and Mary Shiretta Wallace. Kathy is a faithful sister to Bill (deceased), Betty Ann, Richard (deceased), Roberta, Helen, Kelly and Jeff, (aka Jeff).

Kathy is a graduate and proud member of the class of 1970. Following her graduation, Kathy attended Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. She entered the business world in 1973 as the owner/operator of the Martins Ferry Dairy Queen. She operated at this location as a "Big Red" in a community which was our arch-rival in all sports yet prospered as a businesswoman in "Rider Country". Her love and support of her Alma Mater, Bellaire High School, never faltered during her 43 years of operating her Dairy Queen store in Martins Ferry. When she left that business location in 2015, and closed her association with the store, to her credit, even our archrivals were saddened to see her go. During

her years in Martins Ferry, Kathy was a member of the Martins Ferry Business and Professional Women's Club. Attesting to her popularity as the owner/operator of the Dairy Queen, Kathy was recognized as their "Woman of the Year". Kathy is currently employed at Belmont Savings Bank, in Bellaire.

Kathy attended Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Neffs until its closing in 2018, and now attends St. John's Catholic Church in Bellaire. Over the years at the Neffs Church, she served on the Parish Council and the Finance Council, as well as, the Catholic Woman's Club. She served as the Sacred Heart Church Representative to the St. John High School Board of Education. Kathy also served as a lector and Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion.

Kathy's involvement with the community, and active support for the residents living there, is unmatched. For over 45 years, she was a volunteer at local nursing homes and for the past 50 years has been a Santa's helper for fraternal and non-profit organizations. She is also known in the community as a cheerleader, song leader, comedian, and auctioneer. She is a member of the Bellaire American Legion Auxiliary Post 52; Bellaire Fraternal Order of Eagles Auxiliary #371; social member of the Bellaire Sons of Italy Lodge #754; a charter member of the Great Stone Viaduct Education Society; and the Bellaire Touchdown Club.



BONAR NAMED NEW HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Mark Bonar is not a unfamiliar name to Bellaire football. He was recently chosen as the new 2022 head football coach. Mark is returning to Bellaire for the first time since



1996 and the first time being a head coach at the high school level. Bonar was a assistant coach under John Magistro as the offensive play caller during the Big Reds' run of success in the 90s. Although it has been 25 years, Bonar expects to utilize many of the same offensive principals.

Bonar graduated from Shadyside High School in 1972 and attended Bethany College. He is currently a math teacher at St. Clairsville High School but along with becoming the head football coach at Bellaire, he will also join the faculty at Bellaire as a math teacher in the fall.

Bonar, who plans to call the offensive plays, has already had a meeting with students

who want to play football and started to build his coaching staff with Adam Quirk, a former quarterback at St. Clairvsville, and former Bellaire teammates, quarterback Ty Masciarelli and Clint Lekandous. Bonar will also bring back previous staff, Todd Poe, Bailey McGrath, Ryan McMahon, Zach Musilli and Ben Doyle who is currently the Elementary principal, to the staff.

Mark and his wife, Kathy have three children, Marci who is a fifth grade teacher at Bellaire resides with her husband, Adam Quirk and their two children, Jackson and Kira. Bart resides in Alaska and is a Air Traffic Controller. Karlie is a teacher in Upper Arlington and her husband Pete Burkett reside in Central Ohio.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND THE DISTRICT

Big Reds,

Thank you for giving me an opportunity to share some exciting developments within the Bellaire Local School District. This year, we have been working diligently to future proof our school district for the post COVID world. Our certified, classified, and administrative staff have been working closely to ensure our students are placed in a position to be successful.

We are working through several facilities projects that will change the face of our district for years to come. As many of you have noticed, the scaffolding has come down and our beautiful clock tower has been restored to its full glory. We have retained the original clock faces and plan to display them in various places in the community. Our old clock hands will be donated to the alumni association for future endeavors, with the exception of one set in our archives.

Our front yard, Nelson Field, is also getting the attention it deserves. While the former visitor grandstand holds a special place in all of our hearts, it couldn't be saved. We are moving forward with a new visitor bleacher structure, concession stands, and restrooms. We will also upgrade the plumbing, electrical, and PA systems. As a result of this project Nelson Field will have a larger, level plaza inside the main entrance and fulfill ADA requirements.

The district is also investing in cutting edge HVAC technology. Each of our three school buildings have had new chillers installed. The air handlers throughout all buildings have also been upgraded with bipolar ionization to prevent the spread of airborne illnesses. Our new HVAC system increases energy efficiency and allows tighter scheduling windows to prevent the heating and cooling of unoccupied spaces.

We have started the process of reinventing our curriculum in grades PK-12. The Bellaire Local School District is rolling out Project Lead the Way in all grade levels. This program will tie our STEM curriculum to specific areas in the engineering, medical, and computer science fields. For students who are interested in the trades, we are building a menu of industry recognized credentialing programs that can be obtained directly through Bellaire High School. Our reading and math teachers have also been tasked with picking out new instructional materials that are aligned with state standards. I am happy to report that our district is in a solid position to face the future. We are a small school district with big school facilities and educational options. Our staff and students are up to the task of building this school district to stand the test of time.
