2023 OUTSTANDING ALUMNUS RECIPIENT NORMAN BALSEI

Norman A. Balsei is a 1959 graduate of Bellaire High School. As a new graduate, Norman began working with the Plumbers and Steamfitters Local Union 83 in 1960 and was officially taken into the trade in 1961. He served his apprenticeship from 1961 -1965, taking time off in the middle to serve in the US Army. Norman was a Rank Specialist 5 and Maintenance Sergeant during his service in the Army and Army Reserve from 1963-1969. Norman was awarded with the highest academic standing during his time at Aberdeen Proving Grounds in Maryland. In 1965, Norman won a local welding and pipefitting competition and then the WV state competition. He was sent to compete in a national competition in Perdue. At the competition, Norman was the overall winner in the Copper / Silver category as well as the Welding competition. He was the first ever winner from WV and the local WV union.

In 1963, Norman married Mary Ann Camsky- Balsei, Class of 1959, also a graduate of Bellaire High School. They have four children – Kellie (Balsei) Cusick, Class of 1984, Scott Balsei (deceased), Class of 1989, Tracie (Balsei) Hughes, Class of 1990, Jason Balsei, Class of 1994. They also have seven grandchildren, and all of his grandchildren have either graduated from Bellaire High School or will be graduates of BHS. -2023, Scott Balsei - 2026, and Jaxon Balsei-2029. As a father and grandfather, Norman's commitment does not waver when it comes to the Bellaire School district. Over the years, Norman has volunteered and built all of the lifting racks for the wrestling mats so that they could transform the area into a girls' basketball locker room. He worked with the After-School Students and built raised bed gardens for them to grow vegetables for the community. He has never turned down any requests from either of his daughters, both teachers in the district, for help at an event, construct, or repair something for the school or just volunteer for an event. This includes he and his wife helping fifth grade students to bake Christmas cookies every year. With Mr. Young, they took on the task of replacing all of the grill bottoms on the seven Touchdown Club grills that had rusted out and getting them usable so that no new ones needed to be purchased. He has assisted in various other projects that were needed for the kids


and never hesitated to turn down any request for help. Currently, he is in his seventh year of volunteering as a welding instructor at Bellaire High School and helping to teach the students advanced welding skills. Utilizing connections with the local union, which he has been a member of for 61 years, he is able to get assistance with supplies, find opportunities for student growth and open a world in which students can make careers.

Not only has Norman found opportunities for student growth, but he has also been directly responsible for six Bellaire graduates to become pipefitters, with a great possibility of two more this year. In addition, many students have found careers in welding-related fields thanks to Norm's guidance. The skilled labor field is an important part of our valley heritage and having Bellaire students continuing that skilled labor force is exciting! Many of Norman's former students keep in contact with him for advice on their careers.

Norman's devotion to the Bellaire welding class is two days a week, and he usually comes in 45 minutes to an hour early to get the day's welding area set up for the students and many times stays after school to complete a particular student's needs.

Norman had become a skilled trade craftsman with impeccable performance, work ethic, and attendance for over 60 years while being a solid family man and showing devotion to the Bellaire District and the Bellaire community.
