ICHARD (CHAD) BALWANZ, Class of 1970 has been chosen the 2016 Outstanding Alumnus by the Bellaire High School Alumni Association. A coal miner after graduation, Chad soon decided that digging coal was not in his future and joined the U.S. Army in January of 1971. Ft. Knox, Kentucky was the start of a military career that would see him begin as a Private and rise to the highest Chief Warrant Officer rank. He progressed rapidly with increasing responsibility, specialized training, and leadership skills that were widely: chronicled including, the article Veteran Valor: A Green Beret Legend of Desert Storm detailing his mission at the outset of the Gulf War, 25 years

"abandoned ruin", they soon found it was actually: War" to name a few. a village. While farmers tended their crops, a curious child soon found the camouflaged "hide-hole" occupied by the soldiers. Knowing their discovery could lead to capture or death, a silenced gun was made ready. As the commander, Chad quickly and decisively acted by declaring he was "not going to shoot children or unarmed civilians".

That discovery shortly led to truckloads of Iraqi troops. Outnumbered 150 or more to their: 8 Green Berets, there began a daylong battle for survival. In the end, superior fighting skills and later arrival of air support allowed movement and extraction after dark. While many dozens of Iraqi soldiers died that day, all of the Green Berets survived to fight again.

Chad's gallantry in action earned him a Silver Star, the nations 2nd highest award for valor, but his decision to spare the life of an innocent and risking of his own life is still cited in teaching military ethics. The battle itself is in documentaries shown on Discovery and the: History channels as well as numerous books: and articles such as Douglas Wallers "The Commandos", Al Santoli's "Leading the Way", Tom Clancy, and "Desert Storm: A Forgotten

Chad's education includes degrees from Campbell University in Buies Creek, NC and Austin Peay State University in Clarksville, KY; CIA Field Operations Course; Department of Defense Interrogators Course; multiple Special Forces schools; Counterintelligence Courses and Advanced Officer Staff courses. In addition to the Silver Star, he earned a Legion of Merit and 16 other medals, awards and military decorations.

He has served multiple tours in Iraq, Afghanistan, including the Middle East and The Horn of Africa assigned to the Intelligence Directorate of the US Special Operations Command Central. After retiring from the military, he was in Afghanistan as a Senior Intelligence Officer in support of anti-terrorism and targeting of senior al-Qaeda leaders. He was also a Liaison for the Defense Department in the Detroit Joint Terrorism Task Force.

Chad is married to the former Janet Lee Tapp of Catlett, VA and the father of a son, Brandon; two daughters Maggie and Krystin and a step-daughter, Samara Tapp. He currently resides near Glencoe, Ohio and maintains active association with the American Legion.

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT -- Jack Cera

Jack was recently elected assistant whip by the Ohio House Democratic Caucus. His position is the fourth-highest ranking Democratic member of House Leadership. In August, Jack had taken over the informal leadership position as caucus dean, the longest serving member of the minority.



State Representative Jack Cera, a native of Bellaire, Ohio (Belmont County) first served in the Ohio General Assembly from 1983-1996. At that time, he represented Ohio House District 99, which encompassed Belmont, Monroe, Noble, and the northern part of Washington Counties. He returned to the legislature in 2011 when he was appointed to serve as the State Representative of then House District 95. With redistricting taking effect in 2012, he now represents Ohio House District 96, which includes all of Jefferson County, all of Monroe County, and portions of Belmont County.



Representative Cera is a 1974 graduate of Bellaire High School where he excelled in the classroom and on the football field. His 97-yard interception return for a touchdown was a school record for over 20 years. He was recruited to play football at Brown University, but his playing days ended after one year due to injury. He received his Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from Brown in 1978. Representative Cera is married to his wife of 30 years, Becky. They have two daughters: Jaclyn, a graduate of Waynesburg University with both a Bachelor's Degree and a Master's Degree; and Bethany, a student at the University of Charleston and member on the softball team. Recently, a son-in-law was added to the fold when his eldest daughter Jaclyn married USAF Captain Brent Yocum, a young man from Smithfield, Ohio. They currently reside in Texas.

COACH MARK SPIGARELLI - OPPORTUNITY OF A LIFETIME

BELLAIRE - Mark Spigarelli calls it "the opportunity of a lifetime."

And it's one he doesn't take lightly.

Spigarelli officially inked his coaching contract Monday, becoming the 26th head football coach in Bellaire High School history. He takes over for Steve Andres, whose contract wasn't renewed after two seasons and a 5-15 record.

"I appreciate Mr. (Darren) Jenkins (Superintendent), Mrs. (Kassie) Anderson (Principal), Mrs. (Molly) Feller (Athletic Director) and the entire Board of Education for giving me the opportunity," Spigarelli said. "I am excited to have the chance (to be the head coach) and hopefully I can do something good with it."

Spigarelli was actually formally approved by the Bellaire Board of Education, with a 5-0 vote, during a special meeting last Thursday. He, however, asked for the weekend before officially signing the deal.

"The delay (in accepting the job) was to give me time to contact some of the guys I had hoped to get on board with for the coaching staff," Spigarelli said. "I wanted to make sure they'd join me, work with me and that they had the same beliefs as me in all three facets of football."

The new head coach will have his first meeting with his players Wednesday after school and from there it's off and running.

"I am very excited to get started," Spigarelli said. "We're probably a little behind in terms of the weight room and getting to know the kids better, but we'll be OK."

The Nelson Field sidelines will be no place new for Spigarelli. The 1988 Bellaire High School graduate played three seasons of varsity football and then spent 12 years on the varsity coaching staff, working under John Magistro and Gregg Bonar.

"We're trying to get (this program) back to where it was in the good ol' days," Spigarelli said. "I hear people say we don't have the caliber of athletes that we had back then. Well, we could if these kids put in the effort and the time with the commitment to being good."

During Spigarelli's time on the staff under Magistro, the Big Reds won four regional titles. He was an eighth grade coach during the Big Reds' two trips to the Ohio State Championship Games in 1995 and 96. His last two seasons on the Big Reds' staff, which were 2007 and 08, Spigarelli was the defensive coordinator.

"I've been working toward this position and goal for the past 25 years," Spigarelli admitted.

After graduating from Bellaire, Spigarelli attended Ohio University, earning a degree in education in 1992. He also owns a master's degree from OU, too. Spigarelli's teaching and coaching careers started at Union Local. He was an eighth grade football and assistant baseball coach. He then accepted a job at Martins Ferry and was eighth grade football and reserve basketball coach for a short stint.

Now, he's in his 21st year as a member of the Bellaire High School faculty. After taking the 2009 season off from coaching, Spigarelli landed a position at West Liberty, working with the strong safeties.

"I really appreciate everything Coach (Roger) Wailiae did for me the last six years," Spigarelli said. "I learned a tremendous amount of football during that time."

Along with his football experience, Spigarelli was also the Big Reds' baseball coach for two seasons. He guided the 2003 team to a berth in the Division III regional final in Chillicothe.

Spigarelli believes the biggest key to success is building relationships, whether it's within the staff, with the kids or in the community.

"Everyone needs to be on the same page," Spigarelli said. "The kids have to see that you care about them, both as people and players. If they do, I believe they'll play that much harder for you, the staff, the school and entire community."

As for the 2016 Big Reds, Spigarelli is excited about the talent that returns at the skill positions, but he knows depth must be created in the trenches.

"I think, at any level, the number one key in football is in the trenches," Spigarelli said. "I think we're kind of slim up there right now, but from this day forward, I expect the kids to work hard in the weight room."

Spigarelli, who will run the defense, hopes to employ a 4-2-5. Offensively, he expects a mixture of Big Reds' offenses of old along with some of the things he's learned with the Hilltoppers.

"I would like to get back to the days when Mark and Gregg (Bonar) were the offensive coordinators here," Spigarelli said. "We will obviously try to take what the defense gives us."

The Spigarelli era of Big Reds' football officially begins Aug. 27 against newly scheduled, River. The Big Reds don't leave the friendly confines of Nelson Field for four of the first five weeks, but road trips to Shadyside, St. Clairsville and Martins Ferry can be found in the second half of the season.

"I believe we'll be able to compete with any team we have on our schedule," Spigarelli said. "There's only one way for this program to go and that's up after a few down seasons."
