



NEW BASEBALL FIELD

It was Superintendent Darin Jenkins and the school board who got the ball rolling to establish a field for Bellaire students.

Mike Dunfee, Class of 1993 lead his Georgia team to a state baseball title this year. Baseball has been a major part of Mike's life. He is the head baseball coach at Gordon Lee High School in Chickamauga, GA. Last spring his team was the state runner-up. The community reminds Mike of Bellaire. It has a family feeling, where great fans follow the team. Unlike the valley, Georgia prep baseball season has a

much longer lifespan. The kids in Georgia play baseball all year round. After graduation, Mike played collegiately at Carson-Newman in Tennessee. He launched his prep coaching career in the Volunteer State as an assistant for five years. He then

became the head coach at LaFayette High in Georgia. His success there led him to Gordan Lee. This marked Dunfee's seventh season as the head coach at Gordon Lee, a school of some 450 students.



He credits his coaching prowess from his solidly rooted days at Bellaire where he played for Gene Ammirante, John Magistro and Mark Bonar. "Those are three solid dudes. They were great coaches and teachers," stated Dunfee. He went on to say, "They pushed us hard but they made us better, I would run through a wall for them."

Mike and his wife Stacey are parents of two children, Abbey, a freshman, and Nate, a seventh grader. Mike is currently a math teacher and is planning to go into school administration.
